Lower Secondary (GYMNASIO)

General Compulsory Secondary Education is offered at the Lower Secondary School (Gymnasio). Attendance is of a three-year duration and includes the grades A', B', and C'. Pupils attend a **common curriculum for all subjects, without any differentiation.** There are neither braches of studies nor any specialization in a sector.

Day Lower Secondary Schools

Day Lower Secondary Schools constitute the main provider of general compulsory secondary education as they are addressed **to the majority of pupils** of this educational level. They represent 85% of schools offering General Compulsory Education.

Evening Lower Secondary Schools

Evening Lower-secondary Schools are addressed to working pupils over the age of 14 years. Attendance is of a 3-year duration, fully corresponding Lower Secondary Day School.

Music Schools

The mission of Music Schools is to prepare and train young learners who wish to get involved with music professionally, without however falling short in general education, should they finally choose a different scientific or professional field. Pupils in a Lower Secondary Music School attend, besides general education subjects just as in Day Lower Secondary Schools, music classes for 13-14 hours weekly depending on the grade. Good performance in music classes is a prerequisite for pupils to be able to remain in Music Schools, even if their performance in General Education classes is good enough for them to move on to the following grade. Graduates of Primary Schools are enrolled in Lower Secondary Music Schools and in particular in grade A", after a selection by a special committee set up in every Music School separately.

Second Chance Schools

Young learners beyond the 18th year of their age, not having completed compulsory education (primary and compulsory secondary) may attend Second Chance Schools. Second Chance Schools of the country are considered Adult Education Schools in the field of Lifelong Learning. Second Chance Secondary School. The overall degree equivalent to that of a Lower Secondary School. The overall for 2 school years. The education programme differs from the respective one of the formal education system in content, teaching methods and the assessment of learners. Curricula are open and flexible, designed to provide knowledge and develop skills

Organization of the School Year

The organisation of the school year is determined centrally.

The school year begins on 1st September and ends on 31st August of the following year.

The teaching year for schools begins on 1st September and ends on 30th June while the teaching of subjects begins on 11th September and ends by the middle of May.

The exam period follows and is completed by June 15.

The teaching year is divided in two terms:

A' term, from September to January

B' term, from January to May

The teaching year encompasses Christmas and Easter holidays of 4 weeks total duration.

Summer holidays are from 15th June until 10th September.

The teaching hours per week amount to 35 for Day Lower Secondary Schools, while for Evening Lower Secondary Schools teaching hours may range from 24 to 25 depending on the grade.

Timetables are established based on curricula by Ministerial Decisions and are uniformly applied to all lower secondary schools in the territory.

The classes start at 8.15 and end from 13.45 to 14.15 according to the type of school. Classes last from 30 min. to 45 min. and there are breaks of 10 and 5 minutes between them.

School leaving certificate

Sufficient attendance during the teaching year in question is a prerequisite for promotion to the next grade or graduation. The pupils are allowed up to 114 hours of absence. If attendance is characterized inadequate, pupils are bound to repeat the class.

Certification

General Upper Secondary School graduates are awarded a title called General Upper Secondary School Leaving Certificate (Apolytirio). It includes information on the final mark, as well as analytical scores that the student has achieved in different subjects.

Holders of an Upper Secondary School Leaving Certificate are presented with the following possibilities:

To pursue their studies in Tertiary Education if they manage to get the marks required for the Faculty of their preference; this results from the performance at school level and the marks they obtain in the exams at national level (pan-Hellenic exams).

To enroll in Vocational Training Institutes

To take part in competitions for their recruitment in the public or private to join the labor market without specialization.



Gymnasio Gennadiou (Secondary School of Gennadi) is a public school at a rural area south of Rhodes island. It offers lower and upper general secondary education. The school has **25 teachers** and **300 students**, aged 12-18. 
